Dear Mums, Dads and Carers,

As more restrictions begin to lift across the UK we will still be following all the usual protocols we have become accustomed to over this last school year. **Please continue to remember to maintain a social distance of 2 metres and wear a face covering, unless you are exempt, outside of school when queuing on Vicarage Lane to drop off and pick up your children. Please refrain from smoking whilst queuing and on school premises during drop off and pick up times. Please consider other parents and children during these times.**

We have been asked once again to share the public health advice given from the Local Authority. This is If your child has been told to self-isolate because someone in their school bubble has tested positive for COVID-19, then he or she needs to self-isolate at home for ten days. This means not leaving the house, except to go in the garden, and not meeting up with anyone from another household. They cannot attend school, go to any after school clubs, on playdates, take the dog for a walk or go to a playground. This is because 1 in 3 people who have COVID-19 don't display symptoms but can still pass it on. By keeping your child at home, you are helping to stop any further spread into school and out into our communities.

This week has been a busy week. The children have loved 'Mental Health Week' and have enjoyed doing activities all week in school. Thank you to Miss Marsh for arranging this exciting week and for setting up our new well-being room in school that we can't wait to share with you once it is finished!
