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Advice for Child to Self-Isolate for 14 Days – Remote Learning Plan

Dear Parent,

Firstly, can I take this moment to thank you all for your quick response to the Year 3 bubble closure on Friday afternoon and supporting us to make sure this was a smooth transition during collection.

As the original letter stated, all children in the Year 3 bubble must now isolate until Tuesday 1st December, when their first day back in school will be Wednesday 2nd December. Your child does not require a COVID test unless they start to develop symptoms themselves and any siblings are still able to attend school in accordance to the guidance provided by Public Health England so long as no one else within the household bubble has any COVID symptoms or is awaiting a COVID result.

As we mentioned at the time, we would be releasing further details regarding Google Classroom and the Remote Learning Plan in place for your child over the next two weeks.

Starting from Monday 23rd November, we will be using Google Classroom to regularly provide your child with learning. Each day, your child will be provided with at least 1 English, 1 Maths and 1 Wider Curriculum piece of learning and these will be provided with timely feedback either through the 'comments' sections of Google Classroom or via phone calls. Where possible, we will do everything we can to ensure that the learning we set, follows the curriculum the children would normally be receiving in school at this time.

We have already provided your child with their individual pencil case and workbook which can be used for their learning during this period. This can be then be returned to the class teacher through a screenshot for feedback. Alternatively, work can be completed online and returned through the documents provided with each lesson. Please let us know as a matter of urgency if you are having any issues with Google Classroom and we will make endeavour to make alternative provision for you during this time.

By using Google Classrooms, we aim to provide regular feedback to learning, opportunities to catch-up with children and their parent/carers regarding their well-being and time for children to communicate with each other in a safe platform.

As always, we will provide regular updates on the Year 3 and Royston School Twitter feeds.
