I hope this letter finds you well and the new restrictions are not having too much of a negative impact upon you. Thank you again for following the protocols we have in school since our return. The exit at home time has been much better this week with parents and carers leaving the school grounds swiftly. Please **do not** wait by doors for other families after collecting your own child/children and please **do not** gather conkers. We are keeping bubbles separate in school so a swift exit off school grounds really is especially important in keeping us as safe as possible. We are just waiting for a date in the next couple of weeks for our permanent path to be laid. This will replace the black sheeting across the Reception Class outside area. This will be carried out on a weekend to avoid disruption. We appreciate your understanding at this time.

Quick reminder...

Here is our school procedure for reporting test results.

- Between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. Mon to Fri (term time) ring the school office on 01226 722011
- Out of school hours – evenings and weekends we ask that you email the test result through to our new email address **covidresultRSJB@smat.org.uk**. This will be monitored periodically on an evening and at the weekend. **Please do not use our normal email addresses to report test results.**

Following a positive test result, school will always take advice from the Department for Education to see the next steps and this may result in the closure of a year group (bubble) with immediate effect. If the decision is made to close a bubble when children are not in school, a text message will be sent to tell you of the decision. If the children are in school when the decision is made, then a text message will be sent for you to come and collect your child. Siblings should remain in school unless the child/household member starts to display symptoms.

Thank you to all our children who took up the offer of a free hot school meal. The day was a great success and our two lucky raffle winners were delighted with their prizes. Since returning to school, the number of children having a hot meal at lunch is lower than we have previously had. We hope that after our school meal launch day we can entice more children to have a hot school meal.

There are also two Zoom meetings for parents and carers of children in FS2 and Year 1. These will be led by Mrs Levitt who is our phonics lead in school. We will be talking you through our approach to teaching early reading and looking at ways you can support your child at home. Ms. Steele will be there to talk about how we approach reading at school and Miss Openshaw will be there to share what happens specifically in FS2 for our youngest children. We hope you can join us!
