Dear Mums, Dads and Carers,

First of all, I would like to start by thanking everyone for your huge efforts with our remote learning. We have been overwhelmed with the quality of the work that children are producing. I am so proud of our incredible staff for adapting to the world of remote teaching as well as teaching children of Key Workers in school. It is vital that children do the work set on Google Classroom to ensure they do not fall behind the learning of their peers. We will ensure that all work will be available until Sunday evening in all classes to ensure that you can access it at a time that works for your family. We are now in a position to offer all classes a live session every day. We hope this will work to support you at home, allow children time to connect with other children in their class and support the quality of the work that children are producing at home. The live sessions have worked really well in Upper Key Stage Two and Foundation Stage so we are hoping children will enjoy the sessions in all year groups now. Times will be given on your child's Google Classroom. Any lessons taught live will be recorded and shared to allow you to watch later in the day at a time that works for your family.

Just to remind you, you can access Google Classroom on Playstation and on Xbox. We are keeping a list of children that are logging into Google Classroom and for those who are not, we will be contacting you directly to ensure we can support you and your child/ren in completing at least some of the learning tasks. From next week we will be sharing the class attendance every week with the best participation on Google Classroom shared in our weekly letter. We will also be hosting virtual assemblies and Gold awards from next week too- so keep an eye out.

This week we also saw huge disruption due to the snow. I myself had a four-hour journey home by foot, by train and by foot again. Miss Moody also walked 3 hours in the snow to get home on Thursday. Closing on Friday was the right call due to the condition of the roads. We are here to support your children as best we can. If you have difficulties, challenges and concerns please contact us.
