Dear Mums, Dads and Carers,

I hope this letter finds you well. We have been delighted this week to welcome back all our pupils to school. Pupils came in to school on Monday seamlessly, as if they had never been away, which was wonderful to see. I have seen all pupils engaging in the wonderful lessons planned by their teachers throughout the week. Thank you also for the kind words you have shared with school via Twitter, e-mail, cards or in person. Your words mean so much. Ms Steele has been working with the Pupil Council this week as we reflect on our remote teaching period and have taken on board pupils views and how they have found the experience.

Quick Reminder

The times of the school day will remain the same. The school gate will be open in the morning between 8:40 - 8:50 and they will be open at home time between 3:20 - 3:30. This is to allow children and adults to come in safely, staggering the flow into school. All families **MUST** practise social distancing outside school when waiting to come in and **MUST** wear facemasks whilst waiting to come into school and on school grounds. Children still remain in bubbles in school. It is vital that as a community we **ALL** abide by the government rules and do not mix households outside of school.

Hot school dinners can be chosen on the day; the previous system of having a school lunch no longer stands and you can choose on a daily basis. This is to encourage the take up of a hot meal as much as possible. Remember that the school needs to have windows open in all rooms, so the children may need to have an additional layer in order to keep them warm. Any child displaying symptoms must not come to school. If there is a positive case in school, then the bubble will need to close for a ten-day period after the last contact. Any child not in school (other than for illness or due to isolating) will be marked as unauthorised.

All children under the age of 5 or receiving free school meals are entitled to milk. If you would like to order and pay for your child to have milk please register at www.schoolmilkuk.co.uk. Full details are given on the website. The contact number is **01924 908499**.

- Between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. Mon to Fri (term time) ring the school office on **01226 722011**
- Out of school hours – evenings and weekends we ask that you email the test result through to our new email address covidresultRSJB@smat.org.uk. This will be monitored periodically on an evening and at the weekend. **Please do not use our normal email addresses to report test results.**
