


What should I already know?

- Know and locate seven continents and five oceans on a world map, globe and in an atlas.
- Vocabulary: continent, country, capital city, island, ocean, sea, river, coast, cliff, beach, mountain, valley, hill, port, harbour, physical and human features.
- Know that historically, people settled near rivers because they provided necessary water for drinking and growing crops, as well as providing transport and powering machines.
- Find a map of Africa in an atlas and locate the River Nile.
- Locate Burundi, Rwanda and Egypt on a world map and in an atlas and know that these countries are in the continent of Africa.
- Know that the River Nile is the longest river in the world.
- Know that the source of the River Nile is in Burundi, its mouth is in Egypt and it flows into the Mediterranean Sea (links to ancient Greece and Rome).
- Identify the River Nile, including its delta and floodplains, on maps and aerial photographs.
- Plot the River Nile on a map of Africa.
- Compare the River Dearne with the River Nile (including by comparing maps and aerial photographs).

hemisphere	half of the earth – Earth has northern and southern hemispheres – The UK and Egypt are in the Northern Hemisphere
border	a line separating two countries
desert	a waterless area with little or no vegetation
climate	the weather conditions in an area in general or over a long period of time

What will I know by the end of this topic?

- Locate Egypt on a map of Africa and on a world map, and know that Egypt is a country in the north of the continent of Africa. It is in the northern hemisphere.
- The capital city of Egypt is Cairo and locate Cairo on a map of Africa. Know that major landmarks in Egypt are the Great Pyramids and Great Sphinx in Giza and Valley of the Kings in Luxor.
- Egypt has coasts on both the Red Sea and the Mediterranean Sea, and that it shares borders with Libya, Sudan and Israel.
- Egypt is a very dry country, and the majority of its vegetation grows along the River Nile and its floodplain, due to the fact that plants need water to survive.
- A wide variety of crops are grown on the fertile land in the Nile Valley.
- Locate the Sahara desert on a map of Africa and know the key facts about it.
- A desert is a large area of land that gets very little rain each year. Egypt's climate is known as a hot desert climate – it is hot and dry in summer, and warm with little rain in winter.
- In the past, Egypt had a cooler, wetter climate and so there used to be more animals that are now more commonly found in East Africa but the most common animals found in Egypt are now different

- Egypt's population is 98.4 million, compared to 66.6 million in the UK.
